

Clinical Skills in Emergency Surgery



This course is suitable for trainees who have completed their period of basic surgical training and are now ready to expand their surgical skills and to tackle more advanced surgical techniques particularly within an emergency setting.

Course content includes

- Review of knot tying
- Abdominal closure and principles of suturing
- Bowel anastomosis – including size discrepancies, open access and use of clamps
- Moderately difficult access- Anterior/submucosal
- Side to side and transverse anastomosis using stapling
- Assessment: bowel anastomosis
- Principles and safe use of energy sources
- Laparoscopic: Appendix simulations skills practice
