

Chair of Joint Advisory Group on GI Endoscopy (JAG) - role outline

Primary responsibilities summary

- To provide leadership, direction and strategy to the JAG taking into account policy and political developments
- To chair the JAG Committee, ensuring that lay people and all relevant professional groups are represented and able to contribute to the development of the JAG
- To oversee the delivery of the aims of JAG as agreed by the JAG Committee, and ensuring that these are compatible with the requirements of patients, constituent bodies, endoscopy services, regulators, commissioners, and provider boards/executives

Job outline

The Chair provides the leadership, direction and strategy for the JAG. The Chair will be expected to maintain and enhance the national and international reputation of the JAG and to ensure its proper governance. The Chair will ensure that patients and all relevant stakeholder bodies and professions are represented on the JAG Committee and are able to contribute to the development of the JAG.

The Chair will be responsible for overseeing the delivery of the aims of JAG as agreed by the JAG Committee, and ensuring that these are compatible with the requirements of patients, constituent bodies, endoscopy services, regulators, commissioners and provider boards/executives. To achieve this, the Chair will need to build good working relationships with stakeholders, including NHS England, Public Health England, Health Education England, NHS Improvement, leaders of the medical and nursing colleges and societies, regulatory bodies and international groups and organisations.

The JAG Chair will provide leadership and guidance to the JAG clinical leads, namely the Chair of the Quality Assurance of Units Working Group, the Chair of the Quality Assurance of Training Working Group, the Chair of the Bowel Cancer Screening Programme Accreditation Panel, the JAG Head Assessor and the JAG Lead Nurse.

The day-to-day management of the JAG is the responsibility of the JAG office team within the Accreditation Unit at the Royal College of Physicians. The Chair will be called upon to provide high quality guidance and advice to the JAG office team on matters as they arise.

Chair of JAG duties

In particular, the Chair will:

- Lead and chair the biannual JAG Committee meeting (which meets in London)
- Provide expert advice and guidance to the JAG and its stakeholders
- · Represent the JAG nationally and internationally
- Liaise with, provide reports and be accountable to the Accreditation Unit Clinical Director
- Liaise with the clinical leads of the other accreditation programmes based at the Royal College
