An insight into translational surgical research Mr Andrew Beggs

An inspirational talk on novel findings in current research on molecular genetics of GI cancer. Mr Beggs, a Reader in Cancer Genetics & Surgery in the Institute of Cancer and Genomic Sciences of Birmingham University and a newly appointed consultant at UHB, discussed in detail the new genetic discoveries that may give us further insight into the pathophysiology of certain cancers. Additionally, novel discoveries of genetic abnormalities seen in the X chromosome may give us an idea of the probability of that individual developing cancer.

His innovative research, which has recently received funding from Cancer Research UK, on understanding neoadjuvant chemoradiosensitivity in rectal cancer was also discussed.

TaTME- Technical aspects and pitfalls *Mr Roel Hompes*

The concept of transanal Total Mesorectal Excision (TATME) for very low rectal cancers has been gaining momentum, both in the UK and worldwide. This procedure is proposed in highly selected cases as an alternative approach to laparoscopic, robotic or open dissection of the rectum via the abdominal approach. The technique allows dissection of the most difficult part of the surgery deep down in the pelvis (particularly in male patients or patients with the visceral obesity). The benefits of this technique may include ease of procedure due to better views, decreased operative time (if dually operating) and reduced complications (including anastamotic leak). Mr Roel Hompes, presents his numbers from Oxford University Hospital and makes TaTME appear as an extremely feasible and safe procedure on preliminary analysis of the current data, however, larger series are awaited.

Additionally, Mr Hompes enlightened us with technical recommendations and possible pitfalls. In summary:

- 1. Good pursestring
- 2. Find holy plane
- 3. Constantly reassess
- 4. Look for tented triangles/circles
- 5. Use a Proctor when learning to TaTME

TaTME- Experience from establishing a service locally Ms Debbie Nicol and Mr Steve Pande

Ms Nicol and Mr Pande from Worcester Hospital have recently established TaTME at their trust. They presented their case series over the last 2 years (successes and complications) and gave us a helpful insight on what it takes to establish a working TaTME department:

- 1. Supporting Surgeons
- 2. Supporting Theatre Staff

- 3. Supporting Anaesthetists
- 4. Appropriate Equipment
- 5. In hindsight- using a Proctor may have made the process swifter and likely avoided some complications.

TaTME- in Amsterdam- Richard Cobb Fellowship

Mr Steve Ward

The winner of the Richard Cobb Fellowship Award Mr Ward spent 3 weeks in 3 different TaTME units in Amsterdam, including The VU University Medical Center and The Gelderse Vallei hospital. He gained valuable experience and was able to assist in many procedures and witness proctoring by world renowned surgeons.

TaTME primarily took hold in Netherlands. The VU University Medical Center, and The Gelderse Vallei hospital, have performed more than 100 procedures and have published scientific research concerning colorectal surgery and TATME. In addition the Spaarne Gasthuis and recently the IJsselland Hospital have also been trained in TaTME and performed substantial number of procedures. Mr Ward educated us on how it happens there and what to aim for in the West Midlands with the help of proctors.
