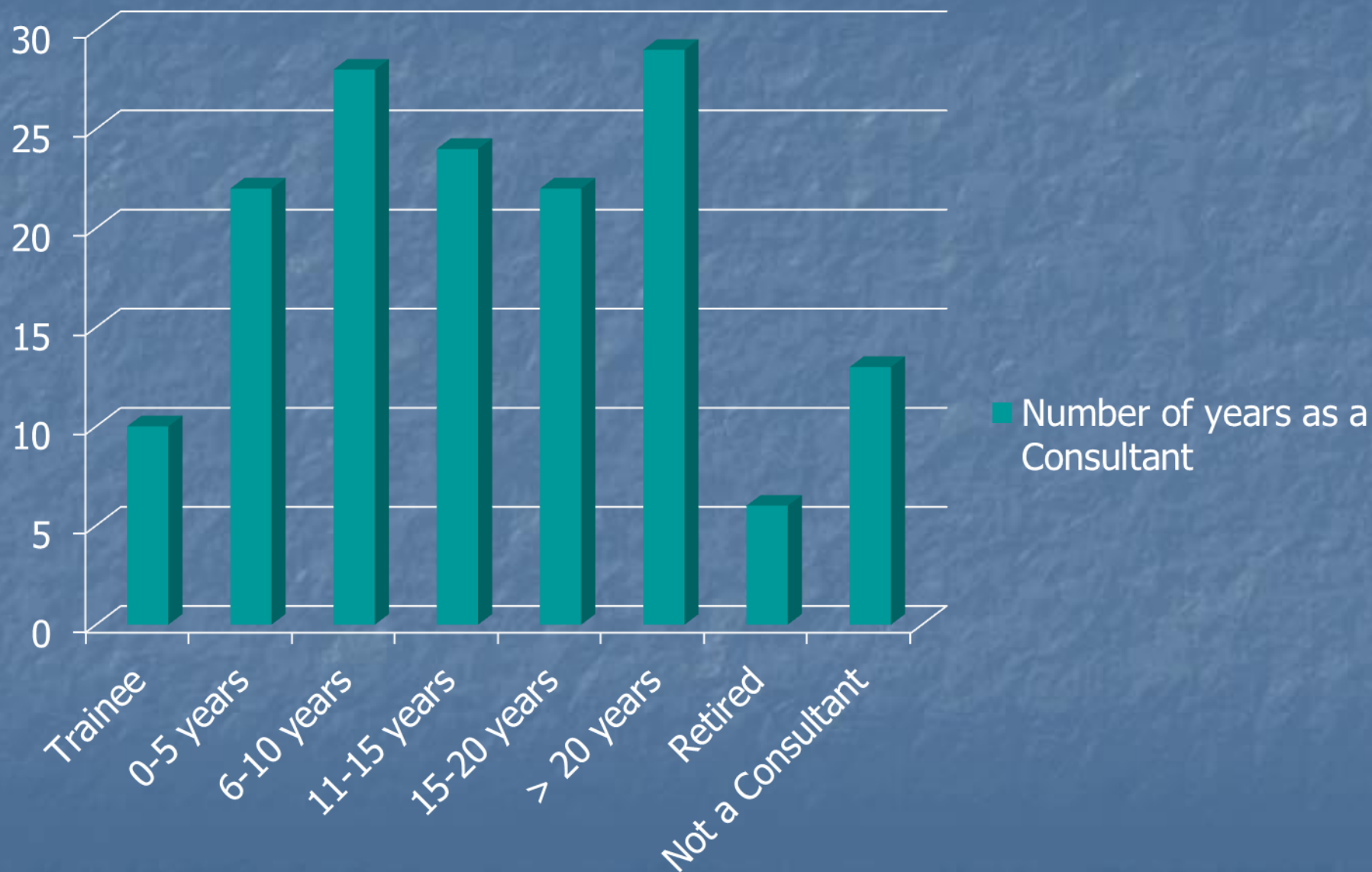
Where do you work?



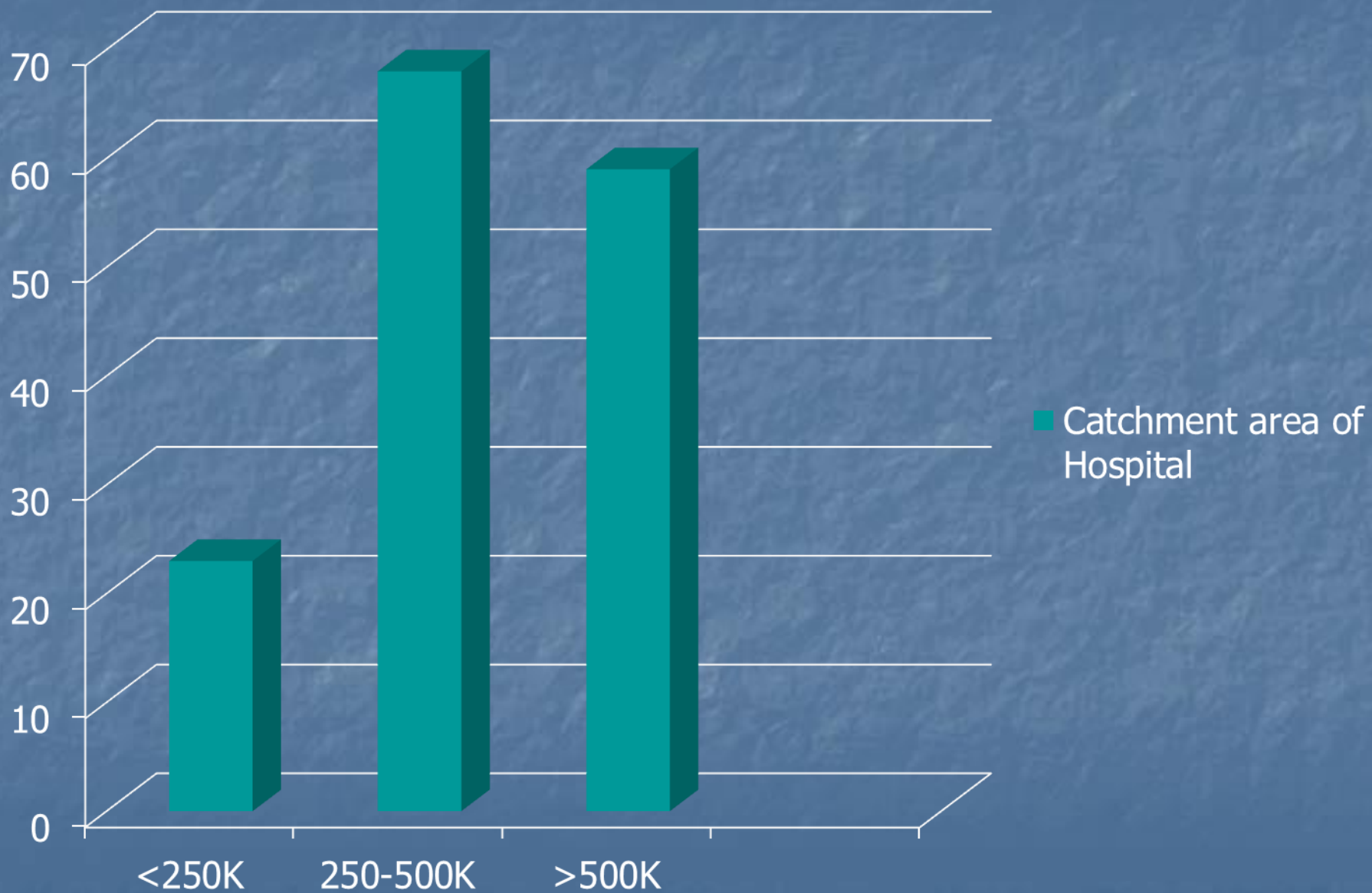
How many times have you been to the following meetings in the last 10 years?



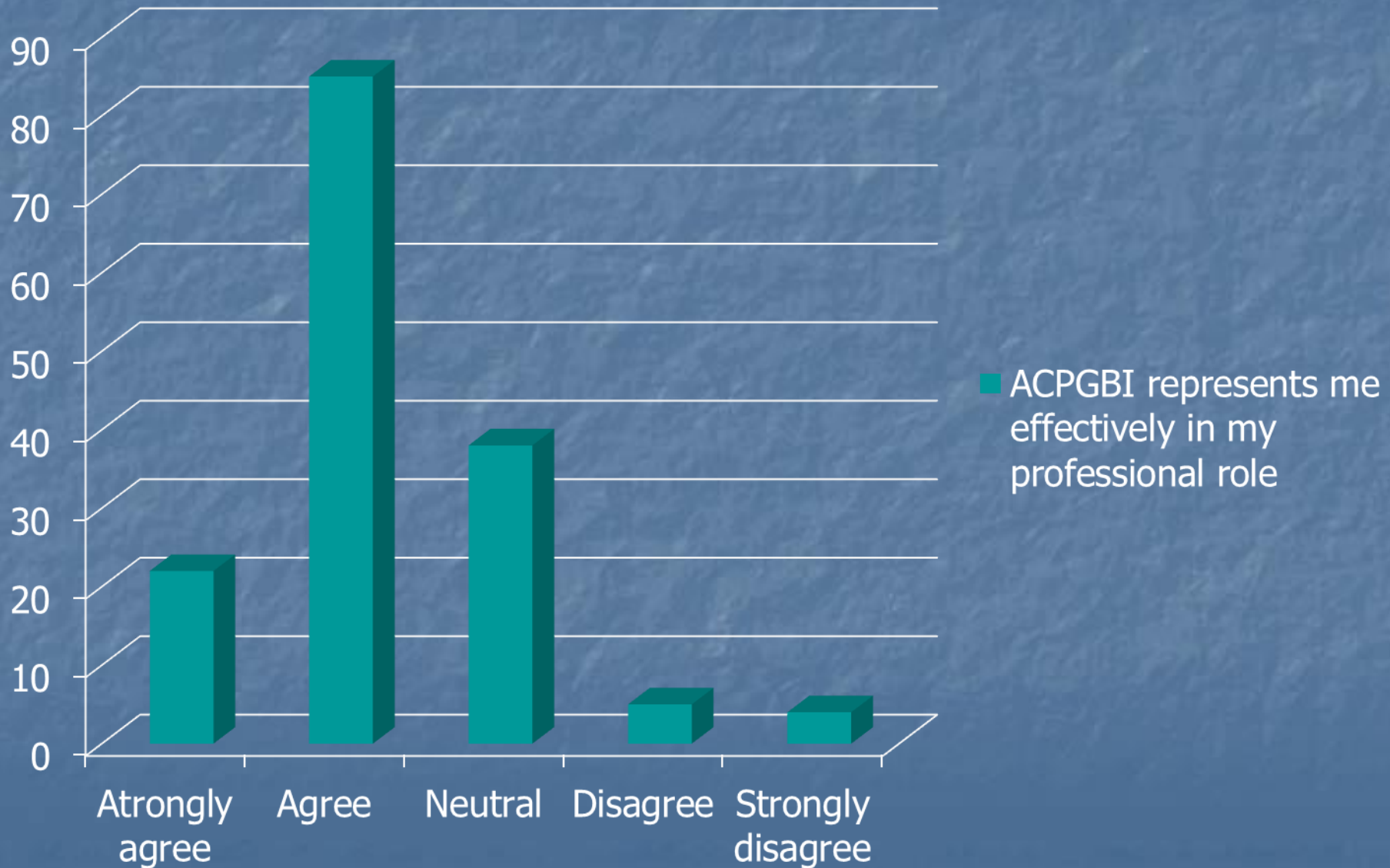
Number of years as a Consultant



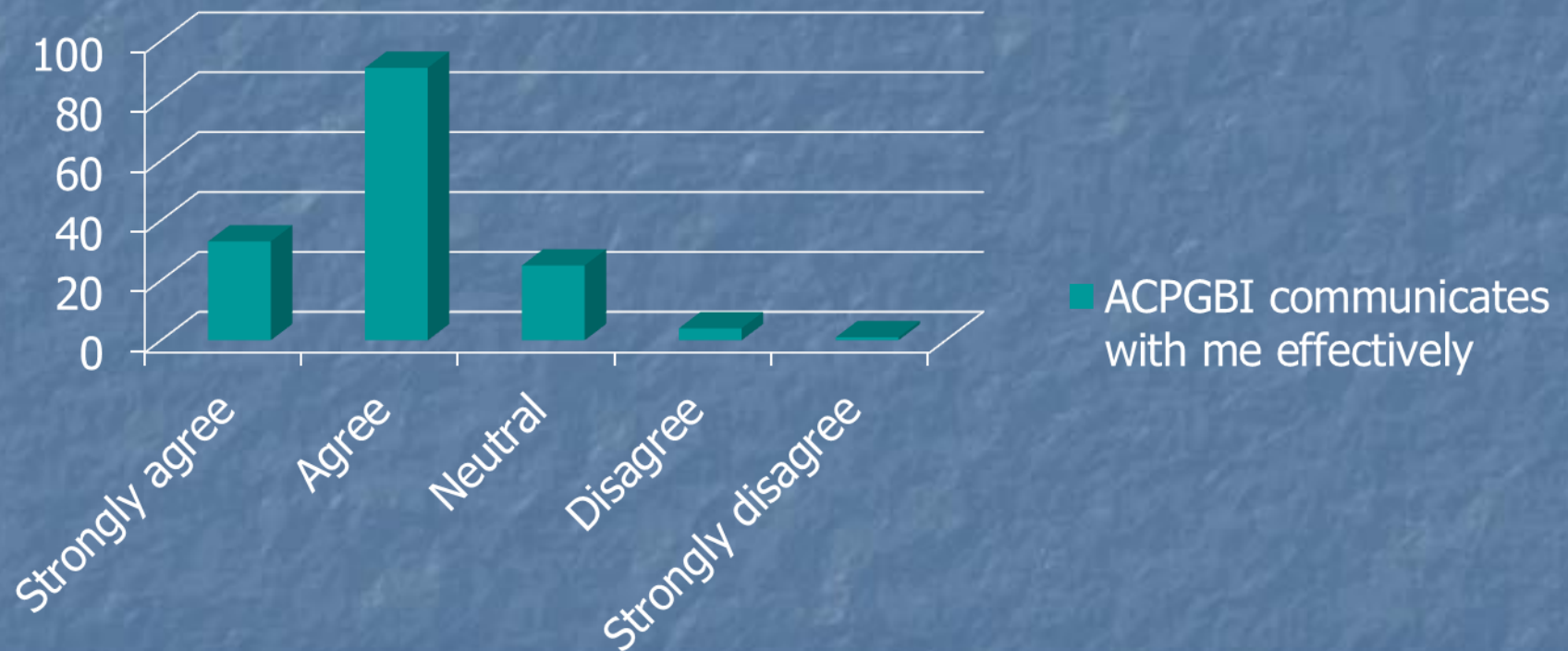
Catchment area of Hospital



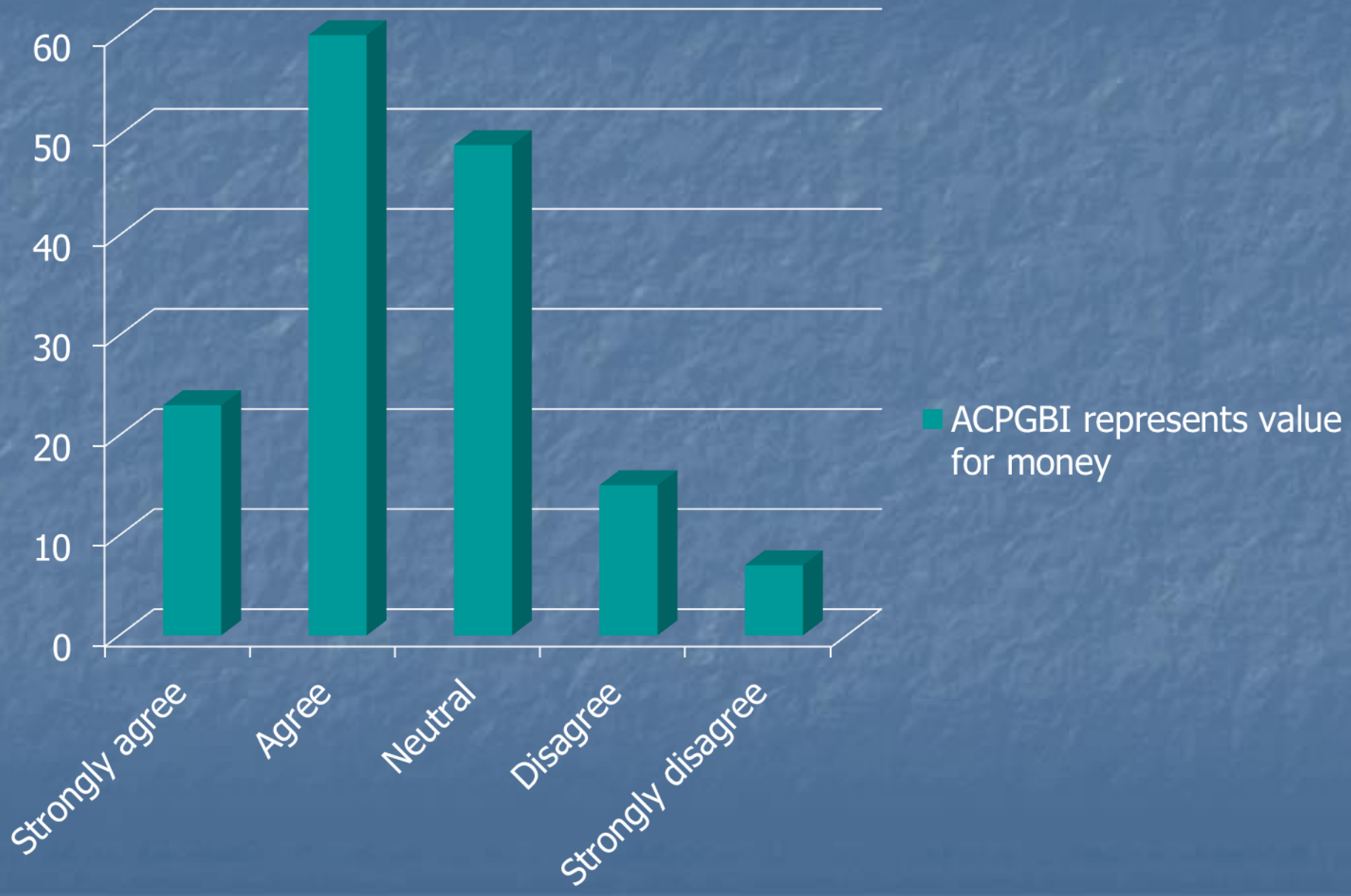

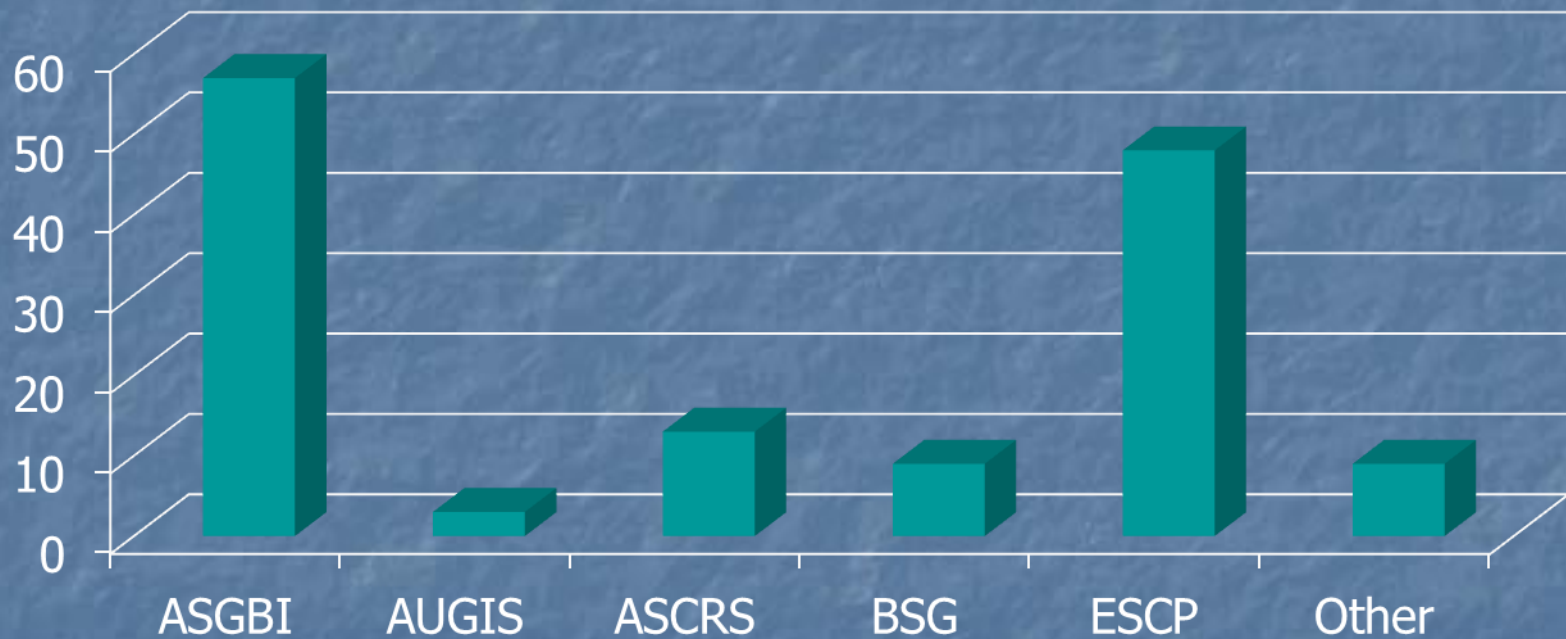
