

- 7. We will let you know if your abstract has been accepted or rejected by Friday 30th August 2013. All correspondence will be with the named presenter at the address given.
- 8. The presenting author whose abstract is accepted must register to attend the meeting and pay the registration fee. Failure to do so will result in exclusion from the final programme.
- 9. Full details of oral and poster presentation format will be emailed after acceptance is confirmed.
