

## **OLYMPUS-CORE NATIONAL ENDOSCOPY FELLOWSHIP 2013**

Applications are invited from researchers with a track record of MD/PhD supervision for a two/three year fellowship project that addresses an important clinical question via gastrointestinal endoscopy. The aim is to attract applications for high quality research projects on a range of subjects that could be explored via gastrointestinal endoscopy. The proposal must demonstrate how the project will have a practical application.

Preference will be given to projects that are collaborative, that affect a significant patient population and that are not dependent on a particular technology. We welcome ideas on different forms of collaboration, for example working with other units, specialties, academic departments or community based healthcare providers.

The fellow appointed to work on the project must register for a MD or PhD degree. The applicant(s) must demonstrate appropriate experience of MD/PhD supervision. The successful applicant(s) will be expected to appoint a research fellow within three months of the award and to make regular reports on progress to the BSG Endoscopy Research Group. The research fellow will be required to prepare annual reports of progress to Core and present results of the research at Core meetings and to produce publications from the project.

The grant will be up to  $\pm 60,000$  per annum with the main cost being the salary of the researcher. Any remaining funds may be used for registration fees for a higher degree.

It is expected that the project will start within 12 months of the award being made. Interviews will be held on 25<sup>th</sup> March 2013.

## The deadline for applications is 5pm on Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> January 2013.
