# National Clinical Directors to the NHS Commissioning Board (24 posts)

The Heath and Social Care Act 2012 has led to the largest structural change to the NHS, since its inception and is designed to put clinicians firmly in the driving seat in the commissioning of high quality services. The independent NHS Commissioning Board will be taking over the day-to-day running of the NHS and now needs dynamic clinicians to take on these national roles to drive this transformation.

Without question, this will be the biggest change to the NHS so it's vital we recruit outstanding and ambitious clinicians from all disciplines, to these part-time roles, who share our belief in the opportunity that clinical leadership presents for transforming our health service.
