Message from the ACPGBI Intestinal Failure Subcommittee: UK National IF Registry Data Additions

As the ACPGBI Intestinal Failure subcommittee, we have decided to collect data alongside the current UK National IF Registry which is sponsored by the British Association for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (BAPEN).

We have expanded the current dataset to include more surgically relevant data to improve the data to identify areas of good practice and themes for improvement.

The six surgical outcomes are listed below. These have previously been studied and reported on, and reflect many of the outcomes in the National Bowel Cancer Audit (NBOCA) report. We have also decided to collect seven areas of audit data that we believe are important for improving the development of the Intestinal Failure network nationally and as a way to improve patient safety. Two of these audit outcomes are already collected within the National IF Registry by BAPEN and all are listed below.

These additional data points are being added to the National IF Data Registry [site](#) alongside currently collected data.
